CHARLES (BUDDY) CORLETT

Buddy started his playing days in New Zealand with Auckland United where he stayed for the duration of his playing years. His 15 years in Auckland teams came with numerous titles, which was a long time record, but his many trips came at an expense as back in those days' players would save all year to be able to attend the national tournaments.

Buddy had a remarkable throw, and would wait until the runner was only a step from the base before letting the ball go. He needed a strong willed first baseman to do him justice and record each one of his outstanding outs.



In 2008 Buddy was made a Legend of Auckland Softball as well as receiving the honour of being named as one of the Top 10 outstanding New Zealand Basketballers of the Century. He was a lifetime Stalwart of the YMCA and he rose to become the Director of the "Panmure Youth Citizen's Gymnasium" and was later awarded an MBE from Queen Elizabeth in 1974 for services to the Community. As much as Buddy may have loved his sport there was no love that could compare to that for his wife, Yvette, who he, just last year, celebrated their 60th Wedding anniversary.

Western Bay of Plenty Softball lost its pioneer. All who knew him knew the love and passion he had for the game and how many tireless hours both he and his wife put in to give us a well oiled competition from junior to senior, for so many years. His dedication to be a part of this year's men's Evergreens team with his ailing health just showed how much of a legend he was. Harriette was a stalwart of the Hawkes Bay Softball Association and trained many scorers within the region as well as ensuring she was always available for official scoring senior men games. She was a life member of the Hawkes Bay Softball Association due to her many hours and dedication to local softball and the Board. She was a member of the local Fastpitch Softball club and gave many hours of dedicated time to help the club grow.

She also assisted in getting softball up and running at Te Aute College for local competition. She also assisted many junior teams by being available for advice while at the front desk on Saturdays and whilst moving around the park. She was a dedicated and hard working representative manager/coach/scorer/ & chaperone for many years.

PHIL PACKER

Phil contributed to Softball in the Hutt Valley for more than 50 years through all aspects of the code. He started his playing career with Wainuiomata and played for the club for 15 years. He was a member of the NZ Defence Team and also served



on the NZ Army Softball Committee. At some time in his career, Phil coached the HV Dodgers Premier Men's Team and the HV NFC Men's Team. He was a current team member of the HV Evergreens Team and the Dodgers Dynamos Presidents team when he passed.

However it was umpiring that Phil was known best for. His kind and gentlemanly manner towards people endeared himself well for this role. He was a Level 5 New Zealand Umpire. Up until his illness Phil was the President and Chairman of the Hutt Valley Umpires Association. He will be sadly missed by everyone in softball.

It is with great sadness we announce to the wider softball community the passing of a great man, and



loyal friend, who was a dedicated and treasured member of the Otahuhu Softball Club. After a long and courageous fight with cancer, Wayne painlessly left us on Wednesday 8th October at 730am at home surrounded by loved ones. He will be missed not just at around our

PRESIDENTS REPORT – LYN LOCKHART

Congratulations to the whole softball community on a fantastic year of softball.

I was thrilled to view the recent video thanking our volunteers and I would simply like to add my heartfelt thanks to you all. We love this sport with a passion and I hate to think of the total number of hours our volunteers gift to our sport, (it is also fair to say all of our paid staff involved in softball also gift us a large number of unpaid hours as well-thanks).

On the domestic front there has been an increase in our playing numbers and long may this continue. We are also thrilled to welcome back two of our Associations who had taken a break from our organisation. Tournament season came and went and having attended a number of the tournaments I never ceased to be amazed at the wonderful job our Associations do on running these tournaments on our behalf.

Internationally this year has been exceptionally busy; our White Sox Women's team competed at their World Championships in Haarlem Netherlands. For the first time in over ten years they made the top 8 in the world. Our CEO Tony Giles attended this tournament as Head of Delegation and as a result of the contacts and networking done by Tony we have received a number of additional opportunities for our players.

As a result of the performances of this team an additional four players have accepted scholarships to play college ball in the U.S.A.

The Junior Black Sox also attended their U19 World Championships and played superbly to make the finals only to be pipped at the post by Argentina. This was a fantastic effort by all.

The Men's 2015 World Championship Qualifier was held at Rosedale Park in December 2014 with the Black Sox, The Australian Steelers and Samoa competing. Games were televised the public were able to watch softball being played at its best. Congratulations to the Black Sox for qualifying as number 1 for Oceania.

For the first time a New Zealand U23 Women's side played in the Australian U23 State championships in April and performed very credibly.

Another first has our Junior Black Sox heading to Europe in August to play in the Euro Super Cup. This is a fantastic opportunity for them in the lead up to their World Championships in 2016.



It is with the best wishes of the whole softball community that the Golden Homes Black Sox and the Junior White Sox head to their respective World Championships in June and July.

From a governance perspective I have presented any issues brought to me by you, our stakeholders and they have been listened to and actioned where appropriate.

To the Softball New Zealand office my sincere thanks for your continued hard work and passion for our sport. I know you give more than 100% and we are lucky to have such a committed team. To Tony Giles our CEO, you have worked wonders over the last year securing us on-going sponsorship and funding and providing leadership to our sport. Perhaps though, more importantly, your establishment of strong strategic alliances with ISF and our International Community which has opened up doors for us that were previously closed.

To our family of sponsors for your on-going support, our appreciation is without question. To the Golden Home owners, staff and franchise owners who are making the trek to Canada to support our Black Sox, enjoy the wonderful experiences softball can provide.

As always in any softball year we have highs and lows, to our extended whanau who have lost loved ones during the year our sincere condolences.

So 2014/2015, has been a good year for everyone, a great year for some, may 2015/2016 provide us with on-going opportunities to develop and play the sport we love and are passionate about.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT – JOHN PRENDERGAST

The board is pleased to have been able to oversee a year of growth in the sport. Following the adoption of the Growing Softball Strategy it is satisfying to see growth in the sport's membership numbers. Softball is one of a small number of sports in New Zealand that is actually growing.

One of the most pleasing aspects has in this growth, has been the revitalization of softball in a number of areas with new associations being formed or reformed. This reflects both the desire in these areas for the sport and the support from SNZ management in assisting regions. This growth, while very positive, is not evenly spread throughout the country, for example, some of our bigger associations seem to be struggling in maintaining numbers, let alone achieving on-going growth.

One of the most important decisions made by your board this year, in keeping with the Growing Softball Strategy, has been to seek a High Performance Director. In making this decision, the board has made it's criteria for this position clear. This is not to be for the support of those at the elite end of our sport only; it is to provide assistance at all levels to lift performance, skills and enjoyment for all players, and also includes coaching, officials and umpiring.

The board has started work to ensure it understands the implications for softball of the Health and Safety Reform Bill. This will have significant implications and obligations for those in leadership roles in our sport, including those in a voluntary capacity. The management of events and tournaments, as well as the general playing of the sport will be impacted by the new legislation.

The financial position of Softball New Zealand continues to strengthen, reflecting prudent management along with targeted and continual fund raising is enabling a wider range of activities.

The number and range of partners and sponsors has increased dramatically and reaches deeply into and across our activities. The board recognizes, and is appreciative of this support. We need to ensure our partners achieve their objectives in their association with us.

My role of chairman has been made so much easier with the committed and experienced board you have. Not only is there an incredible depth of

knowledge about all aspects of softball, but their professional and wider life experiences also helps greatly and ensures we have very balanced discussions



and outcomes on various topics. We have introduced more responsibility and work to the board committees, which is helping in providing the board with advice. My gratitude goes to all members of the board for their input. I particularly appreciate the support from your President, Lyn Lockhart, for her well grounded feedback to the board and also in particular, her wise counsel to me.

The board recognizes the superb management and leadership our CEO, Tony Giles provides. His efforts have had a significant impact in raising the profile of our sport nationally and also in developing the ongoing positive interaction across softball. His efforts have been recognized by ISF and he is actively involved in a number of international activities. Tony is supported by an incredibly hardworking management and support staff. We only have a small team, but their dedication and value is acknowledged by the board.

I would like to thank our many volunteers who up and down the country demonstrate week in and week out their love of the game by ensuring diamonds are ready, games can be scored and umpired, teams coached and managed. You are the people that make it happen. One of the challenges for all of us is to provide opportunities to ensure we continue to attract people to participate in these rewarding roles.

Good progress has been made in many aspects of the Growing Softball Strategy. However, Softball New Zealand cannot do this on its own. We need a national, regional and local approach. I commend those associations that have developed their own plans, taking into account their own goals, but linking into and supporting the Strategy. Unfortunately others appear to be hesitant in embracing this. I would urge you to look at this. To be strong and to continue our growth, we all need to be on same path, influencing the only thing we can..... the future.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE'S REPORT - TONY GILES

For many in the softball community, 2014/15 was the busiest yet most challenging year in memory. Against this backdrop, Softball New Zealand (SNZ) was able to successfully complete a series of major projects, some of which are expected to have far-reaching and we believe positive consequences for our sport.

For the second financial year in succession the softball community was able to embrace an international series on home soil with the Golden Homes Black Sox hosting both Australia and Samoa in the ISF Oceania Qualifier, a series that was broadcast live domestically on SKY Television and negotiated broadcasts into 13 neighbouring Pacific Island nations.

International campaigns also continued to gain momentum with both the NZ White Sox and the Temperzone Junior Black Sox performing at world championship level with great distinction. Both groups met expectations and have made significant gains with ranking points in doing so.

The newly implemented Strategic Plan has allowed SNZ directly and indirectly measure performance against a range of targets relating to the 4 strategic priorities and provides a clear account of SNZ activities. The strategic priorities are our promises to the softball community, and in 2014/15, SNZ has made progress on all of its promises. Growth in participation has been outstanding with a net gain of 6000 entrants to the sport with affiliated participants now reaching almost 33,000 and non-affiliated members totaling 24,893. New associations have affiliated and with a number of negotiations currently in progress those numbers look set to rise again next season. Strong and robust partnerships have been forged with the ISF executive and ISF federation partners around the globe. New and exciting products are being implemented at international level and a high performance programme and an internationally recognized programme director are to be implemented.

Alongside the on-diamond and administrative accomplishments, SNZ achieved a record profit of \$101,767, which compares favourably with the budgeted surplus of \$51,662. Within the competitive landscape of an NSO and that of a declining sport sector funding model, this achievement has exceeded all expectation and represents a positive step change. However, in a fiscal environment where funding opportunities for sport are a constant challenge, SNZ is cognisant of our need to adapt existing streams and develop new streams for growing revenue if we are to maintain the development of Softball in New Zealand, a loss for the 2015/16 year is expected.

The shift in position has been anticipated and is not a reflection on an uncertain or untenable softball environment.

INTERNATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS:

- The NZ White Sox finished a very credible eighth at the world championships held in Haarlem, Netherlands and climbed 5 world ranking places from the 2012 campaign.
- The Temperzone NZ Junior Black Sox finished second at the world championships held in Whitehorse, Canada. This represents the strongest performance in 17 years.
- The NZ Development Boys Team were victorious at the Friendship Series in Sydney, while the NZ Development Girls team continue to identify young talent with a strong showing at the same event
- Softball NZ in conjunction with the NHSA hosted a very successful ISF Men's Oceania Qualifier between the Golden Homes Black Sox, Australia, and Samoa with live prime time television coverage within New Zealand and negotiated broadcasts into 13 other Pacific Island nations
- The Golden Homes Black Sox completed a successful North American tour in preparation for the 2015 ISF Men's World Championship
- Softball NZ successfully trialed a White Sox Under 23 side at the Australian State Championships in Queensland

DOMESTIC HIGHLIGHTS:

- Auckland took out both Men's and Women's NFC titles
- Albion were victorious at the Men's Open Club Championship; and
- Auckland Marist won the Women's Open Club Championship
- Auckland won the Boy's U19 title
- Wellington were successful in the Girls U19
- Auckland won the Boy's U17 championship
- Wellington were crowned the Girls U17 champions
- Auckland won the N.I. U15 title, with Hutt Valley successful with the Girls title
- Canterbury took out both Boys and Girls S.I. U15 titles
- Mt Albert Grammar School won the Boys Junior Secondary School title, with Hamilton Girls High School claimed victory with the Girls championship
- Division 1 Secondary School Champions for the boys were Mt Albert Grammar School and the Girls champions were Wellington East Girls College
- Division 2 Secondary School Champions for the Girls were Whanganui High School and the Boy's winners were St Patrick's College Silverstream
- S.I Secondary School Boys Champions were Kings High School

Strong commercial relationships continue with principal sponsor Golden Homes. Their continued

support of our game across all levels is unparalleled and greatly appreciated.

Temperzone, AWF, and Hellmann Worldwide Logistics provide crucial support across international teams and deliver integrity and professionalism in partnership. SNZ continues to forge strong relationships with central and local funding partners including Sport NZ, HPSNZ, New Zealand Community Trust, Infinity Foundation, Pelorus Trust, Pub Charity Limited, and Trillian Trust.

STRUCTURE AND GOVERNANCE

Under the leadership of the SNZ Chairman, the SNZ Board has provided a strong vision and direction for Softball in New Zealand. The SNZ Board has provided a professional and stable governing environment that has enabled SNZ to achieve its strategic priorities and objectives. I would also like to

personally acknowledge the SNZ President for support and guidance throughout the past year.

It is critical to the ongoing success of SNZ that the focus on excellence is maintained. Both locally and internationally, it is vital that SNZ both gains and retains the respect and trust of players, coaches, officials, administrators, commercial partners, and fans alike and the achievements of the past year reflect and reinforce the good standing of Softball in New Zealand.

It is to this point that I would like to personally thank the staff of Softball New Zealand. Five of the hardest working and most passionate individuals I have had the pleasure to work alongside. Thank you for your professionalism, integrity, patience, and love of our sport.



SOFTBALL MANAGER'S REPORT - GLEN ROFF

The 2014/2015 year has been another demanding yet productive year for New Zealand Softball on a number of fronts. In the previous 12 months an unprecedented 6 national teams left our shores to compete on the international stage. A vast amount of effort has gone into these campaigns from various levels to ensure national teams are able to compete at their highest level.

2014/15 saw a number of changes to SNZ staff with the exiting of Softball Officers Nick Cowan (National Development) and Lesley McIntosh (Organization Development). We wish both well in their new endeavours. Rachel Murphy, (Christchurch based) replaced Lesley and will continue to provide organization support for Associations. In addition, SNZ has been fortunate to secure two international internships in Brittany Lenander (USA) and Moritz Moellenkamp (Germany). SNZ has also been successful in securing funding from ASB Community Trust for two game development officers. The officers will cover Mercer through to Rodney and commence this season.

Coach accreditation numbers saw a 35% increase from 305 to 412 largely due to the efforts of Naomi Shaw and Stefanie Trutanic (Auckland Development Officer). One day workshops have proved a popular vehicle for the delivery of coach education. The online coaching programme implemented in January is progressing with 85 users. All modules in phase one has been uploaded to the site and readily available. Adding modules is a time consuming process but we are committed to uploading existing and additional modules to the platform. In an attempt to provide the best possible service and education to the Softball community a number of existing modules will also be revised in line with the National Player and Coach Development Pathway.

An important area of our game requiring ongoing support is the development of pitchers and catchers in key age groups. SNZ no longer has the luxury of a National Director of Pitching to oversee this process. As an alternative, SNZ attempted to initiate 3 x national workshops catering for under 13 (Rookie Sox), under 15 and under 18 (Emerging Sox). Unfortunately a lack of registrations forced the cancellation of these workshops. It is the view of SNZ that for our game to remain healthy in this key area we must create sustainability by developing quality battery coaches throughout the regions. In an attempt to provide the necessary support, SNZ has developed 6 x week Rookie and Emerging Sox

pitching programs. These programmes are now available for clubs and associations to implement. In an attempt to provide further support is an



online pitching module currently in its final stages of development. The content of the programme and the technical information within was agreed on by a robust discussion through a number of recognized pitchers. To complement the pitching curriculum a 6 x week catching programme is in the process of being developed.

Participation numbers from the last season of play are always of interesting reading. In this past season a large number of associations had an increase in team numbers, with only a small number of associations seeing a decrease. As in previous seasons the analysis between traditional or core softball and social participation based softball is clearly defined. In summary nation-wide, there has been a 2.2% drop in Premier/Senior Teams, a 1.2% increase in Youth Teams (12 years plus) and over, a 1.2% increase in Youth Under 12 Teams, a 33% increase in Social/Community/Slowpitch Teams and a 157.3% increase in School Teams (not Saturday). Overall, it resulted in a 23% increase in playing numbers to 33,000 affiliated players.

In an attempt to gain a wider understanding of people participating in 'some form' of softball SNZ developed a template to capture numbers for non affiliated participation. Numbers collated were impressive with 24,893 New Zealanders having played some form of softball last season.

A number of other notable game development successes last season:

- Online volunteer resources and 'Thank you' video completed
- In final stages:
- Give Softball A Go Day 24 registered events, 4 up on 2013/14 season
- Rookie Sox Manual and promotional material
- Website redesign.

Numerous hours and resources have been undertaken over the last financial year. With stakeholder support we look forward to rolling these projects out over the following 12 months ensuring future generations have the opportunity to partake in our great game.

CHIEF UMPIRE - WAYNE SAUNDERS

In collaboration with your two Deputy Directors we report on the activities of your Softball New Zealand umpiring programme. It remains a pleasure to work with your National Umpiring Staff, a group of volunteers that continue to give freely of their time to staff games, mentor and development, and grow the "The Programme". With the solid support the many changes to the National Umpiring Staff (NUS) were seamlessly introduced. The opportunity to reallocate portfolios was a refreshing change and an opportunity to introduce new blood. Following on from the 2014 NUS meeting the following new appointments were confirmed: Regional Director of Umpiring - Jeremy England (Central); Assistant Regional Directors of Umpiring - Dave Fortin and Duncan Watts (Southern), Lance Brown (Central) and Kevin Gorman (Northern) thus allowing another step in our succession planning to be implemented. A feature from this meeting was Sunday's strategic review – Planning our future.

It is with sadness that I have to report the deaths of two active members Phillip "Phil" Packer (HV) and Charlie Gaze (CB), both were Level 5's and in different ways were valuable members of their respective associations.

It seems timely to again look at this clause in our "Mission Statement" "To create an environment which enables successful recruitment, retention and recognition of all involved with umpiring at any level and to seek continuous improvement ..." In a busy world it is too easy to forget that we all have a duty to others and the continuing welfare of our sport. As volunteers our reward is the enjoyment of what we do. It is essential that local associations continue in their endeavours to create a safe environment so all who participate in our sport can enjoy their involvement.

At the 2014 SNZ AGM Lance Brown, Wanganui was named "Umpire of the Year". A previous winner of this award in 2011 Lance is the President of the Wanganui Umpires Association and is the Assistant Regional Director of Umpiring for the Central Region. Lance continues to be one of New Zealand most respected International Umpires. During the 2013/14 season Lance officiated at the National Fastpitch Championship working the Men's final at 1st base and the Men's Open working the Grand final on plate. Lance also officiated in all three games of the Oceania Test Series between the Black Sox and Australia culminating with the plate appointment on the decider.

Traditional September Regional Clinics were held in both the northern and central regions while the southern region umpires met during the running of the Jefferies Cup. Online training initiated by the ISF has attracted only limited numbers with most of those involved being ISF certified.

I would like to record the "The Programme" appreciation for the tireless efforts of Eugene Gilbert and the valued support umpiring receives from SNZ.



NATIONAL UMPIRE STAFF

AGM reports are the main source of recording umpiring history. Your NUS for last season was Wayne Saunders (UIC), Deputy Directors: Lindsay Edwards and Wiremu Tamaki. We were joined by Regional Directors: Dave Beaumont (South Island), Jeremy England (Central) and Mark Porteous (Northern). Notable among our many tasks: Lindsay continues as convenor of the Level 7 Advisory Group with a new team - Tara Harris, Wiremu, Mark, Lance and Jeremy. Lindsay also manages Merchandising and Distinguished Services Award nominations; Wiremu was Rules examiner and Website Manager, Wiremu and Mark Porteous were the UmpSchool Administrators; Wayne National Tournament appointments. Whilst Assistant Regional Directors Dave Fortin, Kevin Gorman and Lance Brown along with senior umpires Cass Seeling, Tara Harris, and Ray Dyason joined members of the NUS in an expanded group of National Tournament Chief Umpires. With engagement of skill sets available in our group including those of our Assistant Regional Directors we have been adequately staffed. The third DDU position remained vacant.

The annual National Rules refresher is held in the first week of October and has now been running for over twenty years. The rules examination is available to anyone to sit and local associations are encouraged to communicate this to their membership. The "open book" format continues to attract a greater level of participation (a significant increase from the past) with 77 papers returned for marking. 24 candidates successfully qualified for the first time as Level 2 graded umpires by obtaining a pass mark in the newly introduced fifty question Level 2 Rules examination. This continuing success has created a challenge for our umpire associations. Converting our success with electronic recruitment and embracing these success candidates, mentoring and training them to become real day field umpires is a continual challenge. This subject will again be reviewed at our next National Staff meeting. Recruitment and development in most major associations still remains a long-term challenge. Recruitment by word of mouth only, will not meet our future needs.

NATIONAL TOURNAMENTS

This year's National Tournaments were initially fully staffed with the exception of the March Tournaments. With a need of some 70 suitably experienced umpires to fully staff in March, this still remains a challenge. Late withdrawals, notably due to works commitments, have seen the need for local association support for

the staffing of the Secondary Schools. National Tournament's are still the ideal environment for umpires to gain experience and continue to develop their knowledge and learn the culture of umpiring from their more experienced colleagues.

A total of 88 umpires worked this season's National Tournaments completing 1764 assignments. Notable were David Fortin (CB) with 52 games and Heath Lyttle (MC) with 51 games. Tama Howard (AK), Ross Emerson (NO), Leon Hopa (SL), Dennis Ormsby (SL) and Tony Kaiaruna (WN) all officiated over 40 games.

A healthy level of interest and applications for International field umpiring appointments continues. Appointments continue to have a self-funded component however your umpiring programme is very grateful of the support from SNZ for umpires attending ISF World Championships and our established exchange programmes. In addition to the above appointments an increasing number of umpires are receiving self-funded invitations to umpire in Australia.

INTERNATIONAL UMPIRING

As the ISF Regional Umpire Coordinator for Oceania I remain in frequently contact with WBSC Softball Division Director of Umpires Bob Stanton. The International Umpiring Staff participate in rule interruptions and selections of umpires for WBSC sanctioned events. The Rulebook Project Review and Rewrite Committee (PRRC) has now been operating since December 2012. The PRRC is co-chaired by Marlies Struyve (Regional Coordinator, Europe) and myself. Significant progress has been made toward a draft of a new five chapter rulebook in preparation for a draft presentation to Congress this October. New Zealand has been allocated with the review and rewrite of Chapter 4 – Defence. As Team Leader of "Team Defence" I am joined by hard working team members Dave Fortin, Wiremu Tamaki and Mark Porteous. In addition Mark Porteous undertook a complete review of the International Casebook ahead of this year's reissue. In addition I chair the three/four umpire mechanics group who also undertook the

annual review and update ahead of this year's reissue. WBSC updates are available from the ISF UmpSchool website.

With two World Championships each year and the prospect of Softball and Baseball being re-admitted to the Olympics there remains there remains a great many opportunities and challenges.

Grading List Summary - overall numbers of graded umpires remain relatively constant. L1 and L2 grades regularly fluctuate from season to season as we continue to transfer as a sport to electronic recruitment and embrace the pathways offered by SNZ as part of its strategic plan. Grading numbers were as follows: L7 – 19, down from 21, L6 – 15 unchanged, L5 – 17, down from 19, L4 – 38, down from 40, L3 – 6, down from 14, L2 – 32, down from 46 and L1 – 32, down from 59. L1 umpire returns were not received from all associations and remain significantly under reported.

My personal thanks to the National Umpiring Staff and in particular my Deputies Lindsay and Wiremu for the continued support and encouragement in the implementing of change this season. Thank you to all who voluntarily contributed to "The Programme". I hope you enjoyed your umpiring experience enough to return again next season.
