OBITUARIES AND IN MEMORIAMS

TERRY NUNNS

KIWI SOFTBALL GREAT AND WORLD HALL OF FAMER TERRY NUNNS WAS SO TALENTED HE COULD HAVE REPRESENTED NEW ZEALAND AT ANY SPORT, A FORMER ALL BLACKS CAPTAIN SAYS. NUNNS WAS A NEW ZEALAND CATCHER AT FIVE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS FROM THE FIRST IN 1966 TO 1980.



A GOLD MEDALLIST IN 1976, HE CAPTAINED THE NATIONAL MEN'S TEAM AT HIS FINAL SERIES FOUR YEARS LATER. HE WAS LATER ELECTED A MEMBER OF THE NEW ZEALAND SOFTBALL AND WORLD BASEBALL SOFTBALL COUNCIL HALLS OF FAME AND WAS NEW ZEALAND PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 1975-1976.

NUNNS LIVED ALL HIS LIFE IN THE HUTT VALLEY WHERE HE ATTENDED ST BERNARD'S COLLEGE. HIS FATHER, CES, WAS A WELLINGTON FOOTBALL REPRESENTATIVE AND WON A CHATHAM CUP FINAL WITH MARIST IN 1946 ALONGSIDE HIS BROTHERS, RAY AND DES. TERRY WAS TALENTED AT FOOTBALL TOO, BUT LATER PLAYED RUGBY LEAGUE FOR WAIWHETU AND MADE HIS WELLINGTON REPRESENTATIVE DEBUT AT LOOSE FORWARD IN 1965.

NUNNS' SOFTBALL CAREER BOOMED AFTER HE JOINED THE STRONG HUTT VALLEY RAILWAYS CLUB AT 15. THERE HE FORMED ONE OF THE GREATEST PITCHER-CATCHER BATTERIES IN NEW ZEALAND'S SOFTBALL HISTORY WITH LEGENDARY HURLER BILL MASSEY.

THE PAIR SPEARHEADED RAILWAYS TO SIX NATIONAL JOHN LENNON INTERCLUB TITLES IN THE 1960S, INCLUDING FOUR IN A ROW FROM 1962 TO 1965. NUNNS WON A FURTHER FOUR INTERCLUB WITH HUTT VALLEY CARDINALS AND 12 BEATTY CUP NATIONAL PROVINCIAL TOURNAMENTS, CATCHING FIRSTLY TO MASSEY, AND THEN JOHN DAWSON, WHO MARRIED NUNNS' SISTER SANDY.

THE HUTT VALLEY SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION LAST YEAR NAMED A FIELD AT FRASER PARK THE MASSEY-NUNNS DIAMOND IN HONOUR OF THE FAMOUS BATTERY.

A POWER BATTER AND A SOLID RECEIVER WITH A STRONG ARM, NUNNS WAS AN IMMOVABLE OBJECT BEHIND THE PLATE. "IF YOU WERE COMING INTO HOME FROM THIRD [BASE] YOU HAD TO CLIMB OVER HIM TO GET ON TO THE BAG," ANDY LESLIE SAID. "IF A TRAIN HAD BEEN COMING HOME, BRUNO WOULDN'T MOVE ... HE DIDN'T WANT ANYONE TO SCORE."

NUNNS WAS 19 WHEN NAMED ON THE FIRST NEW ZEALAND MEN'S TEAM IN 1966 ALONGSIDE FORMER ST BERNARD'S SCHOOLMATES TERRY BELL AND WAYNE BALDWIN AND HIS BOYHOOD SOFTBALL IDOL, HUTT VALLEY SHORTSTOP AND FORMER PITCHER ROSS SMITH.

NUNNS WORKED THREE JOBS TO PAY HIS WAY TO MEXICO CITY WHERE HE ROOMED WITH LESLIE. THE PAIR JOKED DURING THEIR WEEKLY GOLF JOUSTS DOWN THE DECADES, ABOUT BRUSHING THEIR TEETH IN COCA COLA AFTER BEING ADVISED NOT TO TRUST THE TAP WATER. NUNNS RETURNED WITH A BRONZE MEDAL IN 1966 AND GOT ANOTHER IN 1972.

HIS CROWNING MOMENT CAME WITH A GOLD MEDAL ON HOME SOIL AT THE HUTT RECREATION GROUND IN 1976 WHEN NEW ZEALAND SHARED THE TITLE WITH CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

NUNNS CAPTAINED NEW ZEALAND TO FOURTH PLACE AT THE 1980 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS AND THEN HUNG UP HIS CLEATS AFTER A GLITTERING 20-YEAR CAREER. HE COACHED AT CLUB LEVEL AND WAS ASSISTANT-COACH WHEN THE JUNIOR BLACK SOX WON THE WORLD UNDER-19 TITLE IN 1989.

A BUILDER BY TRADE, NUNNS TURNED TO GOLF AND BOWLS AT HIS BELOVED NAENAE CLUB AFTER SOFTBALL. HE AND WIFE GILL HAD THREE CHILDREN AND WERE DEVOTED TO THEIR THREE GRANDCHILDREN.

SELWYN TAYLOR

SELWYN AND HIS FAMILY WERE ORIGINALLY INVOLVED WITH THE WESTERN SUBURBS CLUB, WITH SELWYN GIVING UP MANY, MANY HOURS IN A VARIETY OF ROLES AS HIS SONS MOVED THROUGH THE GRADES. COACH, MANAGER, YOU NAME IT HE DID IT. SELWYN TOOK UP UMPIRING AND BECAME A QUALIFIED SNZ UMPIRE. LIKE MANY SOFTBALLING FAMILIES, IT WAS NOT UNUSUAL TO FIND ALL FIVE OF THE TAYLOR FAMILY IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE CUTHBERTS GREEN COMPLEX – SELWYN UMPIRING, DIANE SCORING (A QUALIFIED SNZ SCORER) AND RICHARD, GLEN AND BRETT ALL PLAYING – SOMETIMES FOR DIFFERENT CLUBS!

MORE RECENTLY AS HIS FAMILY HAS GROWN, SELWYN HAS DELIGHTED IN WATCHING HIS GRANDCHILDREN PLAY. IT IS TESTAMENT TO THE VALUES THAT SELWYN INSTILLED INTO HIS FAMILY THAT TWO OF HIS SONS, RICHARD AND GLEN ARE NOW GIVING BACK TO OUR CANTERBURY SOFTBALL COMMUNITY BY COACHING AND IN RICHARD'S CASE — UMPIRING.

OWEN 'THE FOG' WALFORD

NEW ZEALAND PITCHING GREAT OWEN WALFORD, THE FIRST MEN'S SOFTBALLER TO WIN WORLD TITLES WITH TWO DIFFERENT NATIONS, HAS DIED AT THE AGE OF 75.

WALFORD, A TOWERING FIGURE IN THE SPORT THROUGH THE 1970S AND 1980S, WAS BEST KNOWN BY HIS UNFORGETTABLE NICKNAME — "THE FOG" — A MONIKER EARNED BECAUSE OPPOSING BATTERS SIMPLY COULDN'T SEE HIS PITCHES AS THEY BLURRED THROUGH THE STRIKE ZONE. IT WAS A TRIBUTE NOT ONLY TO HIS VELOCITY AND DECEPTION BUT ALSO TO THE SENSE OF MYSTERY AND MASTERY HE BROUGHT TO THE MOUND.

HAILING FROM HAWKE'S BAY, WALFORD'S JOURNEY THROUGH THE INTERNATIONAL SOFTBALL SCENE WAS BOTH GROUNDBREAKING AND EMBLEMATIC OF A TIME WHEN NEW ZEALAND WAS EMERGING AS A GLOBAL POWERHOUSE IN THE SPORT. HIS TALENT, HOWEVER, EXTENDED FAR BEYOND NATIONAL BORDERS. HE COMPETED IN FOUR MEN'S WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS, REPRESENTING NEW ZEALAND IN TWO AND LATER THE UNITED STATES IN ANOTHER TWO — A RARE FEAT IN INTERNATIONAL SPORT, AND ONE THAT REMAINS UNMATCHED IN MEN'S SOFTBALL.

WALFORD WAS A KEY FIGURE DURING A GOLDEN ERA FOR THE BLACK SOX AND LATER FOUND SUCCESS ABROAD, FURTHER CEMENTING HIS REPUTATION AS ONE OF THE FINEST PITCHERS THE SPORT HAS KNOWN. HIS ABILITY TO DOMINATE ON THE WORLD STAGE, REGARDLESS OF JERSEY, SPOKE TO HIS DEEP UNDERSTANDING OF THE GAME AND HIS ALMOST UNERRING CONTROL ON THE DIAMOND. THOSE WHO PLAYED WITH AND AGAINST HIM RECALL NOT JUST HIS DEVASTATING RISE BALL AND IMPECCABLE CONTROL, BUT ALSO THE QUIET INTENSITY HE BROUGHT TO EVERY PITCH. TO WATCH WALFORD THROW WAS TO WITNESS A MASTER CRAFTSMAN AT WORK — A PLAYER WHOSE PRESENCE COULD SHIFT THE MOMENTUM OF A GAME WITH A SINGLE INNING.

BEYOND THE ACCOLADES AND THE CHAMPIONSHIPS, WALFORD LEAVES BEHIND A LASTING LEGACY AS A TRAILBLAZER AND AMBASSADOR FOR SOFTBALL. HE HELPED BRIDGE TWO OF THE SPORT'S STRONGEST CULTURES AND INSPIRED GENERATIONS OF PLAYERS ON BOTH SIDES OF THE PACIFIC.

HIS PASSING MARKS THE END OF AN ERA FOR NEW ZEALAND SPORT, BUT "THE FOG" WILL FOREVER LOOM LARGE IN THE ANNALS OF SOFTBALL HISTORY — A LEGEND WHOSE BRILLIANCE COULD NEVER BE FULLY SEEN, ONLY RESPECTED.

OWEN WALFORD IS SURVIVED BY HIS FAMILY AND A GLOBAL COMMUNITY OF PLAYERS AND FANS WHO WERE TOUCHED BY HIS TALENT, HUMILITY, AND THE UNIQUE PATH HE CARVED THROUGH THE SPORT.









OBITUARIES AND IN MEMORIAMS

DOUG MCCAMMON

DOUG'S INVOLVEMENT IN SOFTBALL STARTED IN OTAGO ALONG WITH HIS BROTHERS DES AND BRIAN, QUALIFYING AS AN UMPIRE. DOUG UMPIRED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY IN THE 1960S AND 1970S, AND BECAME SOFTBALL NEW ZEALAND UMPIRE ASSOCIATION'S VICE PRESIDENT AND THEN DEPUTY CHIEF UMPIRE FROM 1974 THROUGH TO 1996. HE TRAVELLED WITH THE NEW ZEALAND TEAM AS UMPIRE OF THEIR TOUR OF THE UNITED STATES IN 1975. DOUG'S WIFE ANN WAS ALSO A SOFTBALL NEW ZEALAND UMPIRE OFFICIATING AT THE 1986 WOMENS WORLD SERIES IN AUCKLAND. A PROUD MOMENT IN DOUG'S LIFE WAS WHEN DAUGHTER TRACY WAS SELECTED AS ONE OF THE CATCHERS IN THE NEW ZEALAND WOMENS TEAM.

DOUG WAS THE PIONEER OF BRINGING SOFTBALL INTO THE NEW ZEALAND TELEVISION SCENE. AS ONE OF TELEVIONS NEW ZEALAND'S LEADING SPORTS PRODUCERS HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR PRODUCING ALL SOFTBALL EVENTS IN NEW ZEALAND THROUGH THE 1980S AND 1990S. IN THE 2000S WHILE WORKING FOR CANTERBURY TV, HE WORKED ALONGSIDE CHERYL KEMP AND CANTERBURY SOFTBALL TO BRING THE LOCAL CLUB SOFTBALL SCENE ONTO TELEVISION SCREENS IN CANTERBURY. THESE WORDS FROM DOUG'S DEATH NOTICE IN THE PRESS SUM UP DOUG PERFECTLY: A TRUE GENTLEMAN AND A GREAT GUY.

DOUG'S LIFE WAS FILLED WITH REMARKABLE ACHIEVEMENTS - AN ENTHUSIASTIC PILOT WHO PROUDLY REPRESENTED NEW ZEALAND, AN ACCOMPLISHED TELEVISION SPORTS PRODUCE, A PASSIONATE CONTRIBUTOR TO SPORT AS VICE PRESIDENT OF THE SOFTBALL NEW ZEALAND SOFTBALL UMPIRE ASSOCIATION - BUT HIS PROUDEST LEGACY WAS THE LOVE, RESPECT, AND ADMIRATION HE EARNED SIMPLY BY BEING A GOOD MAN. HE WAS A MAN OF QUIET STRENGTH, DEEP WARMTH, AND UNWAVERING INTEGRITY - A WONDERFUL MAN WHO LEAVES THE WORLD GENTLER, KINDER AND PROUDER FOR HAVING KNOWN HIM.

JOHN MONEY

JOHN STARTED HIS SOFTBALL AT THE PAPATOETOE SOFTBALL CLUB AS A JUNIOR PLAYER. HE WORKED HIS WAY UP TO THE CLUB PREMIER TEAM AS A CATCHER. ALONG WITH THE TEAM PITCHER PETER MITCHELL THEY TRANSFERRED TO THE MARIST CLUB.

DURING THAT TIME JOHN PLAYED FOR THE AUCKLAND PREMIER NATIONAL TEAM. HE LATER TRANSFERRED TO EDEN ROSKILL WHERE HE FINISHED HIS PLAYING CAREER.



JOHN THEN TOOK UP ADMINISTRATION WHERE HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR STARTING UP THE FIRST AUCKLAND JUNIOR COMMITTEE, PLUS ALSO STARTING THE VERY SUCCESSFUL WINTER CLINICS.

IN THE 1992-93 SEASONS JOHN WAS AWARDED THE AUCKLAND SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION SERVICE AWARD.

DIANE TAYLOR

DIANE WAS ONE OF OUR SNZ SCORERS BADGE HOLDERS BASED IN CANTERBURY. ORIGINALLY SCORING OUT OF THE WESTERN SUBURBS CLUB, DIANE STARTED SCORING WHILE FOLLOWING HER FOUR CHILDREN (RICHARD, GLENN, ANGELA AND BRETT) IN THE SPORT. SHE WENT ON TO GAIN HER SNZ SCORERS BADGE IN 1997 AND WAS A CONSTANT FIGURE OFFICIALLING AT A NUMBER OF LOCAL AND NATIONAL TOURNAMENTS.

WHILE SHE HADN'T BEEN SCORING RECENTLY, SHE HAD TAKEN GREAT JOY IN FOLLOWING THE SOFTBALLING ACHIEVEMENTS OF HER CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN. THE SCORING AND SOFTBALL FRATERNITY PAY THEIR RESPECTS TO DIANE'S FAMILY - A LOVELY LADY WITH A HEART OF GOLD.

PENNEY DUNCKLEY

PENNEY WAS A TALENTED SPORTSWOMAN FROM EARLY IN HER TEENS. SHE PLAYED A VARIETY OF SPORTS, NAMELY SOFTBALL, HOCKEY AND BASKETBALL, WHICH MEANT A BUSY LIFE OUTSIDE OF SCHOOL. HER MUM, TRISH, TOLD HER TO PICK ONE SPORT AND SO IT WAS THAT PENNEY PICKED THE SPORT OF SOFTBALL TO FOCUS ON. PENNEY LIVED FOR THE GAME. PLAYING FOR HER CLUB, BURNSIDE, SHE WAS SOON SPOTTED FOR HER TALENTED LEFT-HANDED SKILLS ON FIRST BASE, AND ELUSIVENESS WITH THE BAT, WHICH EARNED HER REPRESENTATIVE HONOURS FOR CANTERBURY, AS A 15-YEAROLD, AND THEN LATER ON FOR NZ.

IN 1979, UNDER THE COACHING OF EDDIE DOLEJS, PENNEY TRAVELLED TO JAPAN TO PLAY IN THE WHITE SOX, ALONGSIDE SYNONYMOUS NAMES SUCH AS ROBYN STORER AND CHERYL KEMP. AFTER PENNEY MET HER HUSBAND, JOHN, THEY SHIFTED DOWN TO INVERCARGILL. THERE SHE PLAYED FOR MARIST AND THEN GRASMERE AND IN THE 1985/86 SEASON WAS NAMED MOST VALUABLE PLAYER. AFTER GRASMERE FOLDED, PENNEY FINISHED OFF HER CLUB PLAYING DAYS IN THE INFAMOUS PANTHERS ALL STARS WHERE THEY WON THE MAJOR RESERVE TITLE 9 YEARS IN A ROW. THEY WERE ALSO CONSISTENT HOLDERS OF THE CONDUCT CUP BUT NEARLY LOST IT ONE YEAR WHEN PENNEY GOT INTO A 'DISCUSSION' WITH AN UMPIRE OVER A RULING. PENNEY'S KNOWLEDGE OF THE RULES WAS SOUND, AND YOU WOULD OFTEN FIND HER AMONGST ANY DELIBERATIONS. PENNEY EASILY FOUND HERSELF IN THE SOUTHLAND WOMEN'S SOFTBALL TEAM WHEN SHE FIRST CAME SOUTH FROM CANTERBURY. SHE QUICKLY WAS REGARDED AS A GREAT TEAMMATE, VERY KIND AND GOOD FOR A CHAT, BUT ON TOUR, NOT ALWAYS THE BEST ROOMMATE DUE TO HER UNTIDINESS.

FOR MANY YEARS PENNEY WAS A MEMBER OF THE SOUTHLAND WOMEN'S EVERGREENS SOFTBALL TEAM. IN 1994 THE TEAM, AFFECTIONATELY KNOWN AS THE 'DRIED ARRANGEMENTS', VENTURED TO BRISBANE FOR THE WORLD MASTERS' SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT AND COMPETED IN THE A SECTION HAVING TO PLAY TOP TEAMS FROM THE US, CANADA AND AUSTRALIA. THEY DID NOT DISAPPOINT. LIKE ANY GOOD SPORTSPERSON, WEAR AND TEAR EVENTUALLY TAKES ITS TOLL ON THE BODY.

FROM NUMEROUS CATCHES OF THE BALL ON FIRST BASE, IN THE EARLY 2000S, PENNY NEEDED TO HAVE HER RIGHT THUMB SCREWED

AND WHEN THE REST OF HER BODY SAID 'NO MORE GAMES FOR YOU' SHE TOOK ON THE COACHING ROLE AND SHE WAS OVER THE MOON WHEN THE SOUTHLAND EVERGREENS TEAM TOOK OUT THE NATIONAL TITLE LAST MARCH IN FRONT OF A HOME CROWD.

PENNEY'S SOFTBALL LEGACY LIVES ON WITH THE SOUTHLAND WOMEN'S EVERGREENS TEAM AWARDING THE "PENNEY DUNCKLEY MEMORIAL TROPHY" EACH YEAR.



NEVILLE TRUEMAN

NEVILLE TRUEMAN WAS A DEDICATED COACH AND CONTRIBUTOR TO THE MID CANTERBURY SOFTBALL SCENE DURING THE 1970'S, 1980'S AND 1990'S. UNDER NEVILLE'S DIRECTION, IT COULD BE CONSIDERED THAT MID-CANTERBURY WOMEN'S SOFTBALL IN PARTICULAR PUNCHED ABOVE ITS WEIGHT ON THE NATIONAL STAGE. UNDOUBTEDLY SOME OF NEVILLE'S PROUDEST MOMENTS IN SOFTBALL WOULD BE SEEING DAUGHTER SUZY BECOME A STALWART IN THE NEW ZEALAND WHITE SOX TEAM, INCLUDING AT THE 2000 SYDNEY OLYMPICS.

The Softballer of the Year award recognizes individuals who exemplify exceptional commitment, leadership, and passion for the sport. This accolade is open to players, administrators, or volunteers who have made significant contributions to the game.



DISTINGUISHED SERVICE

Christine Nukunuku - Auckland

This season our Distinguished Service Award recipient's contributions to the sport of softball span decades, and her unwavering dedication to the game has made her one of its most respected figures. Her career is a true testament to the passion and commitment required to elevate the sport at every level, both on and off the field. **Christine Nukunuku** began her service to softball in the mid-1970s, first taking on the role of Secretary of the Hawkes Bay Saints Club from 1975 to 1977. This marked the beginning of a remarkable journey that would see her become a cornerstone of the Hawkes Bay Softball community, where she served as Secretary of the Hawkes Bay Softball Association from 1977 to 1986. During this time, she not only contributed to administrative duties but also took on leadership roles in the region's scoring community, serving as Secretary/Treasurer of the Hawkes Bay Scorers Association from 1980 to 1986 and earning her New Zealand Scorers Badge in 1981.

In 1979, Christine's dedication to the game expanded to the national level, as she began working as an official scorer for New Zealand tournaments, a role she has held continuously for over four decades. Her vast knowledge and precision as a scorer made her a key figure in major national softball events, and her talent for capturing every moment of the game through statistics has set a standard for excellence in the sport. Christine's service to the game also includes roles with numeros clubs and teams across New Zealand. She has been a long-standing team scorer for Auckland Marist, Pakuranga Pacers, and Ramblers men's teams, and has also supported the Auckland Representative teams.

Her work in the Auckland Premier competition and as a statistician for New Zealand National Tournaments from 1990 to 2006 has been invaluable in maintaining the high standards of play at the top levels. Her contributions went beyond just scoring and statistics—Christine also served as a manager for the Auckland Under 15 Boys team in 1994 and took on multiple leadership roles, including Secretary of the Pakuranga Pacers Softball Club from 1997 to 2004 and Media Coordinator for the Auckland Softball Association from 2002 to 2009.

Her leadership and organizational skills have consistently supported the success of teams and competitions. Her service has not been limited to administrative roles alone. In 2003, she became Anorthern Deputy on the New Zealand Scorers Panel, a position she held until 2010, and she continued to serve as a statistician for the New Zealand White Sox at the Olympic Qualifier in Taiwan in 2006. Additionally, she made significant contributions to New Zealand's international teams, including as statistician for the New Zealand Junior White Sox during their World Series in China (2002-2003) and as statistician for the New Zealand All Stars team in 2002. Beyond her technical

(2002-2003) and as statistician for the New Zealand All Stars team in expertise, Christine's long-standing commitment to the game has been recognized by her peers and organizations. In 1987, she was named a Life Member of the Hawkes Bay Softball Association, and she continues to serve the sport in various capacities, including as Treasurer of the Auckland Scorers Association since 2000, and has been the Manager for the Ramblers Premier Men's team since 2015.

Christine's tireless work ethic, leadership, and passion for softball have made her a true trailblazer in the sport. Her contributions have left an indelible mark on New Zealand softball, and she is a highly deserving recipient of the Distinguished Service Award.









LIFE MEMBERSHIP

It is with immense respect and gratitude that we present LYN LOCHKART with LIFE MEMBERSHIP for her unparalleled dedication and tireless service to the sport of softball in New Zealand. Lyn's career has spanned decades, and her contributions have left an indelible mark on the softball community, both domestically and internationally. Lyn's journey in softball management began with her role as the Junior White Sox Manager from 2003 to 2007, a period during which she made history by leading the team to their first-ever participation in the Canada Cup. This was just the beginning of a storied career that would see her take on key roles with New Zealand's premier women's team, the White Sox. As White Sox Manager from 2004 to 2010, Lyn guided the team through four major international campaigns, including the 2006 World Championship in Beijing, the 2007 Olympic Qualifier in Taiwan, the 2010 World Championship in Caracas, Venezuela, and the 2018 World Championship in Tokyo, Japan, where she stepped in as a cover for a manager facing a medical emergency.

Lyn's leadership and organisational skills extended beyond the White Sox, as she served as Head of Delegation for multiple international events, including the 2012 Yukon Canada, 2014 Haarlem Netherlands, and 2015 Oklahoma USA tournaments. Most recently, in 2023, she served as Head of Delegation for the Black Sox and U18 Girls teams in Pago Pago, American Samoa.

Her involvement with Softball New Zealand has been pivotal on many fronts. As a Board Member from 2008 to 2011, Lyn served as both Chair of the Personnel Sub Committee and Deputy Chair, making key decisions that shaped the future of the sport in New Zealand. Her leadership skills were further recognised when she was appointed President of Softball New Zealand from 2013 to 2016, where she worked tirelessly to advance the sport's development. Lyn's commitment to the game extended to her role as a Dispensation Committee Member/Chair from 2007 to 2022, as well as her significant contributions to tournament organisation and coordinating the Gillies Shield entry for the White Sox in Australia in 2007. Her administrative and event coordination expertise continued with her volunteer management for the 2004 Men's World Championship, where she served as the Co-ordinator of Volunteers.

In addition to her leadership roles, Lyn's work behind the scenes has been equally impactful. She was an active Scorer for Softball New Zealand from 2000 to 2004 and has been a Tournament Representative from 2006 to 2021. Her influence continued to be felt as a Facilitator and Presenter at SNZ Annual Workshops in 2024, where she shared her extensive knowledge with the next generation of softball leaders. As a Manager's Mentor for the New Zealand White Sox in 2024, Lyn has planned and coordinated tours, including the 2024 Canada Cup, and shared her expertise with new managers, ensuring the continuity of excellence in the team's operations. Her contribution to the sport's institutional knowledge is further reflected in her creation of the Manager's Manuals, detailing everything from how to approach team communications to logistics of international softball tours

Lyn's long-standing commitment to the sport also extends to her work with the Softball Foundation New Zealand, where she has served as Trustee and Chair since 2022, continuing her legacy of leadership and dedication to the sport's growth and recognition. For her decades of service, visionary leadership, and unwavering commitment to softball at every level, Lyn Lockhart is a true icon of the sport in New Zealand. Her work has shaped the futures of countless athletes, coaches, and volunteers, and her impact will be felt for generations to come. It is with great pride that we recognise her with Life Membership, an honour she richly deserves. Lyn's contribution to softball is both vast and deeply respected. However, in all my time, nobody - nobody - has stood with, fought for, and supported our program with the passion, determination and strength of character that Lyn Lockhart has.
