Served in a variety of administrative positions after distinguishing himself as an umpire. Umpired in 1972 International Softball Federation ISF Men's World Championship, was the Umpire-In-Chief (UIC) for 1976 Men's World Championship, assistant UIC for 1980 Men's World Championship and ISF assistant rules Interpreter (1981). Member of International Joint Rules Committee on Softball (1976-1978). Elected President of the New Zealand Softball Association in 1983. From 1989-1993 served as South Pacific Region Vice-President. Member of various ISF Commissions' including Legislative, Playing Rules and Umpires. In 1993, named chairman of the Umpires Commission.


International Softball Federation Recognises and honours Raymond Weaver of New Zealand

Charlie Phillips (Deceased)

For his contribution and dedication to the development and growth of world softball as an umpire by electing him to the ISF Hall of Fame in the year of 1999.

As Umpire-in-Chief for the New Zealand Softball Association for 13 years, Charles Phillips was responsible for the establishment and development of a standardised national training and grading system for umpires in New Zealand. The experience he gained as an International player, umpire and administrator over 30 years facilitated the advancement of umpires on the international scene.

Phillips organised the regular exchange of umpires and training programs between New Zealand and Australia as well as other affiliates of the International Softball Federation. As South Pacific Regional Umpire-in-Chief he assisted with the standardised International umpires training program.



Merrell Ferguson

For her contribution and dedication to the development and growth of world softball as an umpire by electing her to the ISF Hall of Fame in the year of 2001.



Wayne Saunders

For his contribution and dedication to the development and growth of world softball as an umpire by electing him to the ISF Hall of Fame in the year of 2009.

Wayne Saunders has served the International softball umpiring community on and off the field since the mid 1980's. Over that time period he worked in all four of the ISF's world championships – a combined total of seven such tournaments including four senior men's championships. His peak assignment was the Olympic softball competition in 2004 in Athens, Greece. Among others, Wayne also worked events such as the Canada Cup and the Prague Softball Cup. He has also served the game in his role as an ISF Regional Umpire Coordinator and has been a part of several umpire clinics as well.



Wiremu Tamaki

For his contribution and dedication to the development and growth of world softball as an umpire by electing him to the World Baseball Softball Confederation – Softball Division (WBSC-SD) Hall of Fame in the year of 2019.

Wiremu continues to serve the WBSC softball umpiring community on and off the field and has done so since 2003. During this time, he has worked five ISF/WBSC world championships which includes two career highlights – the first New Zealand umpire to call a world championship final and an Olympic final. Both events taking place at the 2007 Junior Women's in Enschede, Netherlands and the 2008 Beijing Olympics. While he continues to serve the softball community on the field, off the field he is the current Softball New Zealand Umpire-In-Chief leading the fraternity in raising the mana and prosperity of delivering quality umpiring and having fun while doing it with the softball community.



Lindsay Edwards

For his contribution and dedication to the development and growth of world softball as an umpire by electing him to the World Baseball Softball Confederation – Softball Division (WBSC-SD) Hall of Fame in the year of 2022.

Lindsay has served the International Softball Community on and off the field since the mid-1990s. During this time, he has worked two ISF world championships and a number of international qualifying tournaments. While he continues to serve the softball community on and off the field, Lindsay leads the Softball New Zealand umpiring community as the Lead Alumni delivering the communities assessment framework.
