## **Annual Rules Test Policy**

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### **Annual Rules Test**

#### **1. Background and Purpose**

The Softball New Zealand (SNZ) Umpiring Programme annual rules test aims to establish the process by which the softball community will be tested to measure their aptitude of the rules of softball.

The objective of this policy is to ensure a transparent process is provided for the softball community to engage and be tested and measured against the rules of softball.

#### **2. Scope**

This policy covers the process our softball community and members follow to engage with the annual rules test.

#### **3. Policy Statement**

The annual rules test is an integral part of delivering quality umpiring to the softball community and a continual educational process to keep the community up to date with the rules. Members are encouraged to take the rules test to measure their knowledge of the rules. As a result, the rules test is an open-book experience that is completed online or taken as an oral test.

#### 4. Responsibility

The NUS is accountable for managing the annual rules test and will assign appointed members to the Rules Committee to administer the rules test process, including the time-frame for completion.

Local UICs are responsible for advising their membership of the rules test and to encourage members to complete the test.

Members must complete the open-book test individually and **not as a group**.
